We have been getting to know the children this half term and completing the Reception Baseline Assessments. This information is then used to plan our curriculum, based on children's learning and development needs.






Daily Routines

Please note: Water bottles must contain water only.




Milk

Themes/Topics















Forest School



We are very lucky to have access to a Forest School area in Reception. Each Reception class has one morning and one afternoon session in Forest School each week.

Our learning focus for each of these sessions changes weekly. For example:

- Phonics Hunts/Listening Walks
- Number Hunts/Sorting and Counting natural objects.
- Observing and commenting on changes in the environment.
- Natural Art activities.
- Physical Development.
- Minibeast hunts/Bug hotels/Den Buillding...

Please ensure that your child has a pair of named wellies that can be kept in school.





Observations of Children

We closely observe the children's learning and development during child-initiated play activities and adult-directed activities.

We use the information gathered during these observations to identify children's individual next steps in learning and enable us to make an assessment about a child's learning and development.

These next steps then inform our future planning.

Observations may be taken in the form of notes, photographs or videos.





Home Observations



Tapestry provides the opportunity for parents/carers to upload their own observations of their child in the form of notes, photos or videos.

If your child does something that you would to share with us in school you will be able to use Tapestry to do this.

For example: a photograph from a visit to the park, a video of them singing their favourite nursery rhyme/song. It could be something new that your child has shown you they can do at home – counting, reading, writing.



Spare Clothes

Please ensure that your child has a spare change of clothes in school (including underwear).

This does not need to be uniform.

If your child has an accident/uses their spare clothes, we will send their bag home for the spare clothes to be replenished. We really appreciate your support with this. ©




School Fund



These books will be matched to your child's phonic knowledge.


These books will be sent home for your child to read to you, with your support.
