Nursery Visit Days and Home Visits

At the end of this presentation we will be providing drinks and refreshments. During this time, we will ask you to sign up for a visit day in June and a Home Visit in June/July.

In order to provide a smooth transition and settling in period for all children, we use a staggered start system in September, with a view to all children being in nursery full-time by the end of September.

Details of this will be handed out during the Home Visits.

What is the Early Years Foundation Stage?

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the stage of education for children from birth to the end of the Reception year.



It is based on the recognition that children learn best through play and active learning.



This is a very important stage as it helps your child get ready for school as well as preparing them for their future learning and successes. The curriculum recognises that, from when your child is born, their early years experience should be happy, active, exciting, fun and secure; and support their development, care and learning needs.

"Adults who help children to play are adults who help children to learn."







The EYFS Curriculum consists of 7 Areas of Learning and Development

Children should mostly develop the **prime areas** first:

- 1. Communication and language
 - 2. Physical development
- 3. Personal, social and emotional development.

As children grow, the prime areas will help them to

develop skills in the **specific areas**:



- 5. Mathematics;
- 6. Understanding the world; and
 - 7. Expressive arts and design.

Each of the 7 areas of learning has its own set of <u>Early Learning Goals</u> which determine what most children are expected to achieve by the <u>end</u> of Reception Class.

At the start of the school year, the children will attend part time, to enable them to adjust to the new environment and routine.

Details of attendance times for individual children will be given out separately.

If a child has difficulty settling we may continue the part time sessions for more than the first three weeks.

Most children do settle fairly quickly.

Please endeavour to bring and collect your child on time.

Children who arrive after the start of the session often find it harder to settle.

Likewise, at the end of the day, it is important that children are collected on time so that they don't become anxious when the other children have left.

If you arrive late (after 8.55am), please sign your child in at the main school office, where a member of staff will take them through to the class teacher.

It is important that you always let the Nursery staff or school office know if there are any changes to your child's collection arrangements. We will not hand over children to adults unless we have been informed of who they are going home with.

They can be left in a bag on their peg to be used if needed.


Please ensure all clothes are clearly labelled with your child's name as they may get confused and

Outdoors is an extension of the indoor classroom and will be accessed on a daily basis by the children in all weathers. Please ensure that they have a pair of <u>named</u> wellington boots. It would be beneficial if you could leave them at school as we cannot predict the weather. However, feel free to take them home when they are needed.

On sunny days, particularly at the start and end of the school year, please put sun cream on your child before school and send in a hat to wear outside.

The cost of a school meal is £2.10 a day; this must be paid through **Evolve- Online Meals System**.

Milk and Fruit

Milk and fruit are provided each day for the children, for which there is no charge.

If you would like your child to have milk, you must complete a milk form.

Nursery Fund

We kindly ask that you contribute 50p per week to Nursery Fund, which pays towards special snacks, baking activities and other special treats for the children. If possible, we would be grateful if you could provide a box of tissues per term.





In Nursery, we closely monitor children's learning and development through careful observations. We use a secure online learning journal called 'Tapestry' to record observations of children whilst they are at school. These observations inform our assessments and enable us to plan for their individual next steps in learning.

Tapestry also allows us to share these observations with parents through a secure app. The app is free to download to a smartphone or tablet. You will be able to view your child's observations and make comments, as well as being able to upload your own photos or videos of your child with things that they have done at home. In order for us to share observations with parents, all we will require is an email address.

We share lots of our learning experiences on Tapestry!













Key Person

Once your child has settled into Nursery, we will assign them to a member of staff who will be their 'Key Person'. The role of the Key Person is to build up a safe and secure relationship with your child to ensure that they can develop both socially and academically in our nursery. If you have any concerns about your child please speak to your child's Key Person. It is often possible to see them very briefly at the beginning or end of the day, but do make an appointment to be sure that they are available if you need more than a few minutes.

All staff plan together on a weekly basis. The planning is based on the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework.



Our Nursery classrooms are made up of different areas of provision where children can learn through play, developing all areas of learning.



Home visits provide an ideal opportunity for such knowledge to be shared in an informal way.

SCHOOL COMMUNICATIONS - NEW PARENTS

At Grosvenor Road Primary School, we use a School App called **Parentapps Connect** to communicate efficiently with all our parents.

This App is free to download and is available for both Apple and Android devices. It enables you to receive <u>ALL</u> MESSAGES, LETTERS and DOCUMENTS from school.

Additionally, it will provide you with instant access to our term dates, event information, website, school meal ordering portal and to view and submit future consent forms easily. The app will also enable you to invite additional family members, ensuring that the right people have access to important information.

We will use the app to send targeted messages (specific to your child / their class) via push notifications, so you are not bombarded with messages that are not relevant. The app is also fully secure and GDPR compliant.

It is essential that your child's 'Priority 1 Contact' is able to access ParentApps.

Please note: important messages / letters will be sent to you via the app




